## Ofsted Highlights



Pupils enjoy their learning. They behave well in lessons and around the school. They are polite and respectful to both adults and each other. They say that they feel safe in school. Leaders have a detailed knowledge of the school's strengths and weaknesses and evaluate its performance accurately.

Leaders have ensured that the curriculum is broad, balanced and accessible to all.

Leaders work well with teachers to improve the quality of teaching so that it is now typically good. Procedures to monitor pupils' progress have been sharpened. As a result, progress information is now far more accurate.

Governors hold the school to account vigorously. They provide effective challenge and support for school leaders.

Children in Early Years make good progress throughout the year.

Pupils who have SEN and/or disabilities make good progress from their starting points. Parents are highly supportive of the school. They recognise the positive changes already brought about by the present leadership team.

### How will these be achieved?



- ✓ Structured Senior Leadership Team meetings
- ✓ Regular monitoring and feedback by leaders at all levels
- ✓ On-going support from and collaboration with Frays' colleagues
- Termly data analysis to track progress of all groups of pupils, particularly higher ability
- ✓ On-going Continuing Professional Development for staff
- Full Teaching & Learning review carried out by Executive Headteacher/ Headteacher

### Timelines

- 30<sup>th</sup> November: Staff survey complete
- 13<sup>th</sup> December: End of initial consultation Full Governing Body vote on whether to proceed
- January: Academy Order issued by North-West London and South-Central Head Teacher Board
- February onwards: Due diligence (best guess is 6 months)
  - Full Governing Body final vote
- Summer 2019: Keep Hatch becomes an Academy
