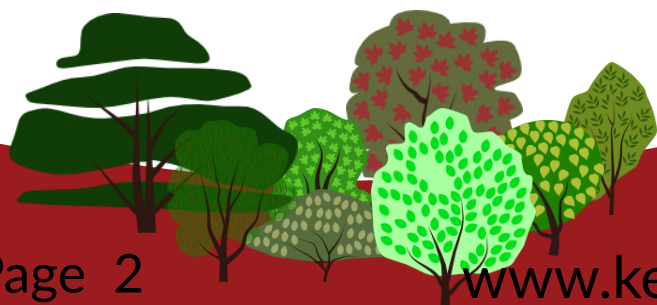


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Blackbirds	Maleeq for trying really hard in his work. Amelia for working hard and always smiling!
